Finger Spelling

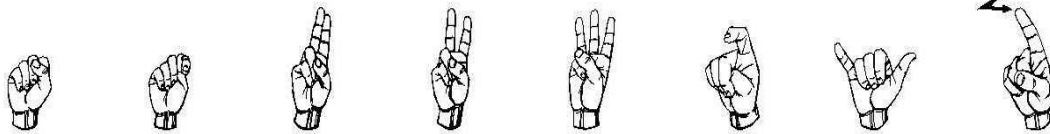
Many signs are made by using a hand that shapes a letter from the ASL alphabet. When reviewing the labels the directions will tell you which alphabet hand to use.

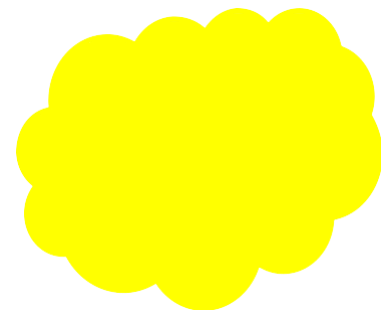

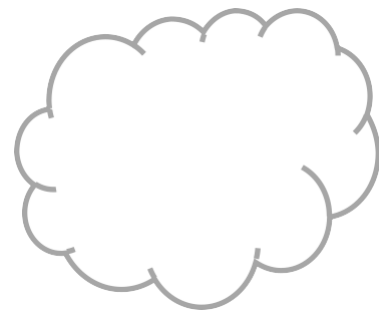

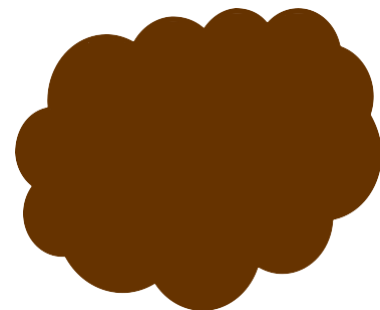

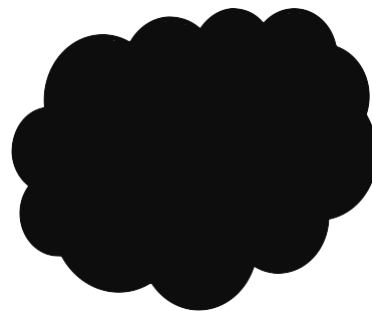

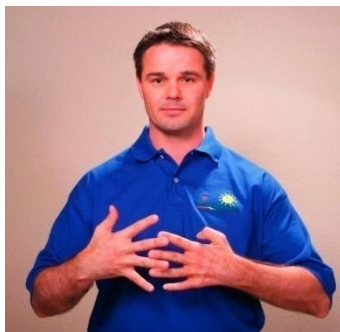


Use your index finger and trace across your eye brows.

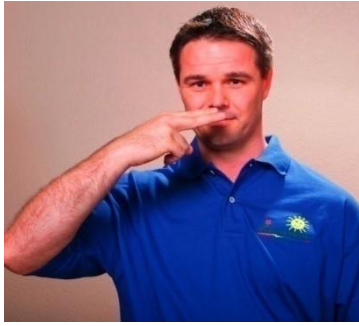


Bend fingers and pull away from the faces, making an angry face at the same time.

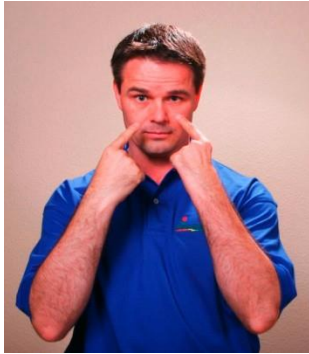


The outspread fingers are move down in front of the face to show that the features of a face are drooping .

Signing Tip

Many times in American Sign Language the same sign is used but represents something different. It depends upon the context of the conversation but also the gender.

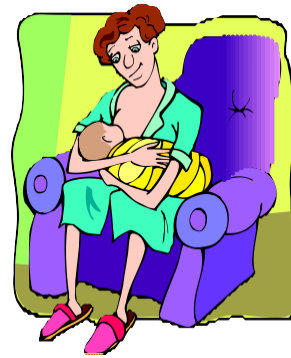
When signing the family or people if the sign is done on the top half of the face it will represent a male. If the sign is done on the lower half of the face it will represent female.

Example –

The sign for cousin is the C hand-shape held up to the face. If the sign is done near the temple it will represent a male cousin but if the sign is made near the chin it will represent the female cousin.



**The fingers of the five hand-
shape is wiggled with the
thumb by the side of the chin.**

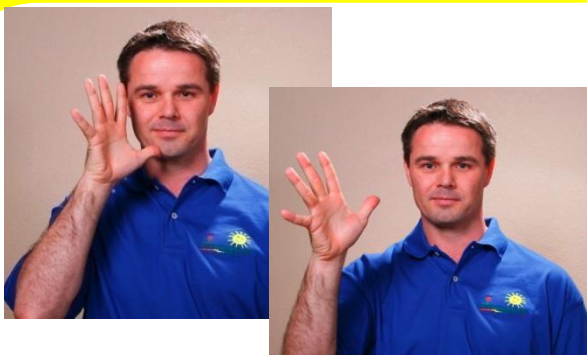


The sign for Father is moved out from the forehead twice in small circular motions.

The sign for Mother is moved away from the chin twice in small circular motions.

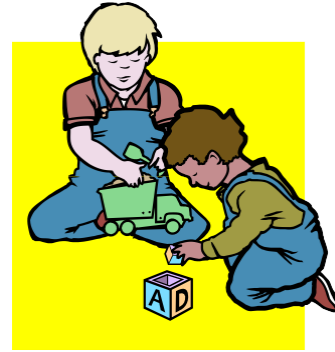

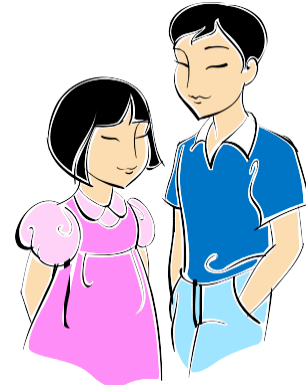

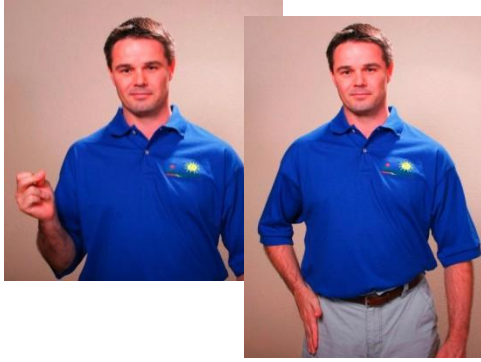

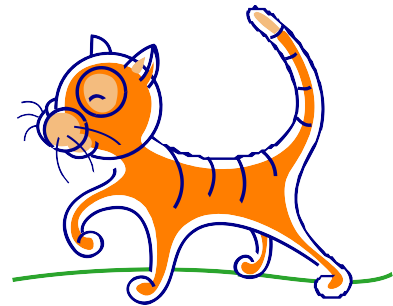

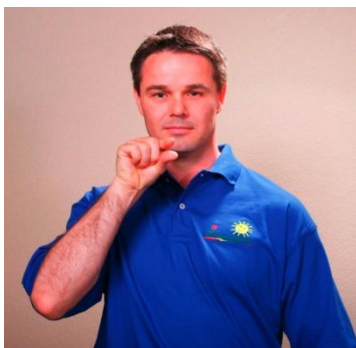


Use your fingers as if stoking a cats whiskers.

The thumb and forefinger mimic a bird's beak.

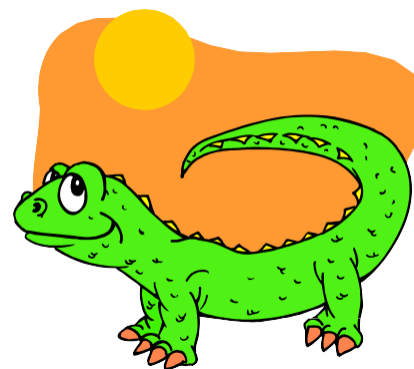

Point, bring back and point again in front of the nose using two fingers .

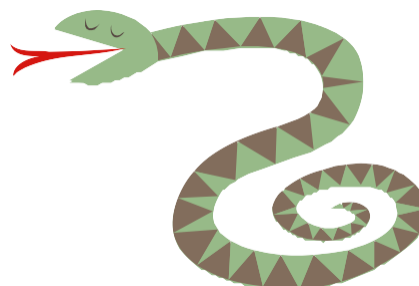

Use a curved V hand-shape back and forth signifying a snake slithering in the grass.

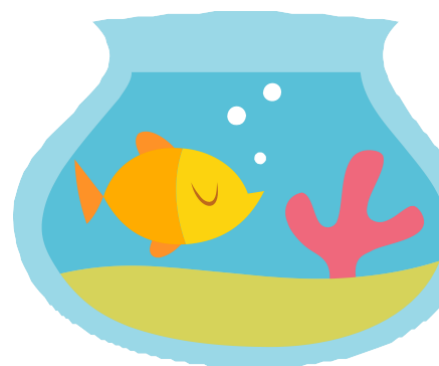

Use a flat hand on its side to mimic a fish's tail.

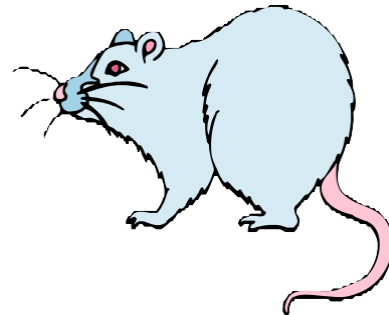

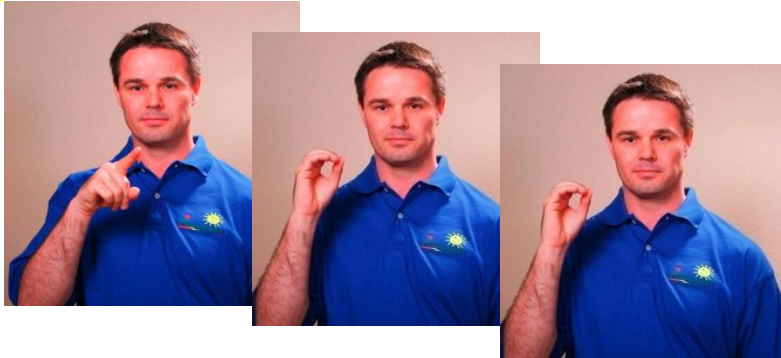


The forefinger brushes across the nose to signify a mouse's twitching nose.

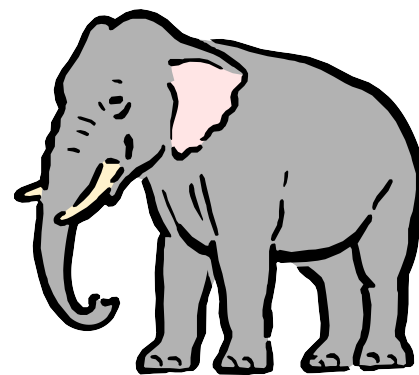

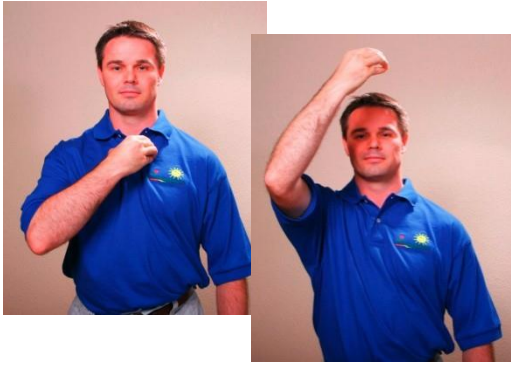


Use your hand from your nose down in front of your body to signify the trunk of an elephant.

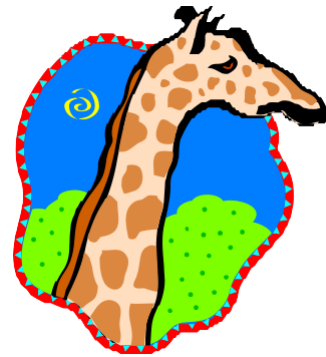

The cupped hand going up the neck signifies the long neck of the giraffe.

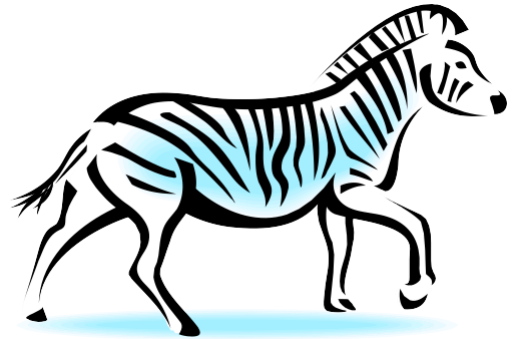

The four hand-shapes are pulled across the body to signify the strips on the zebra.

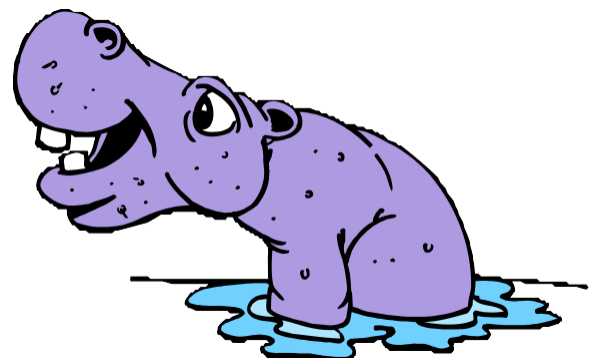

Two Y hand-shaped tap each other on the wrist mimicking the open and closing of the mouth .

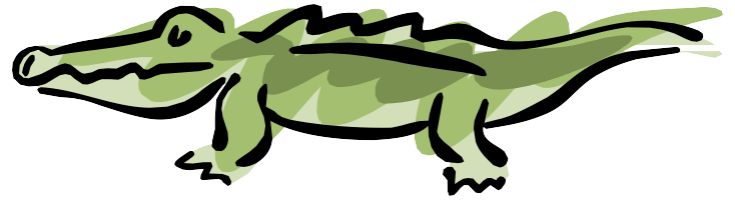


Hippopotamus

Use both hands with open fingers as if an alligator was opening and closing his mouth.

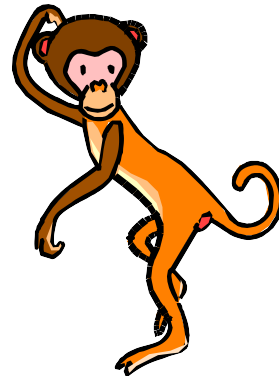

The hands cross the chest and mimic scratching.

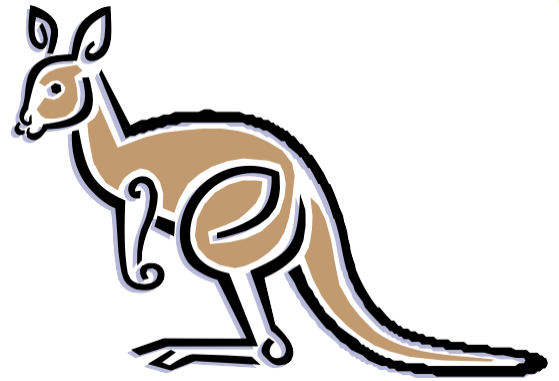

Mimic the arms of kangaroo hopping.

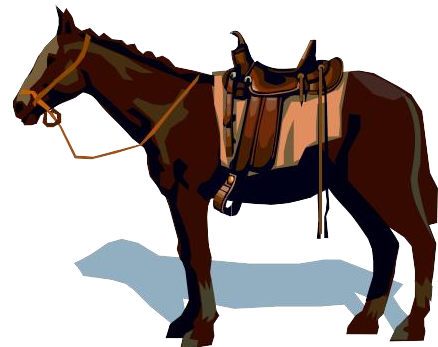

Both H hand-shapes to the top-side of the head signifying the horse's ears.

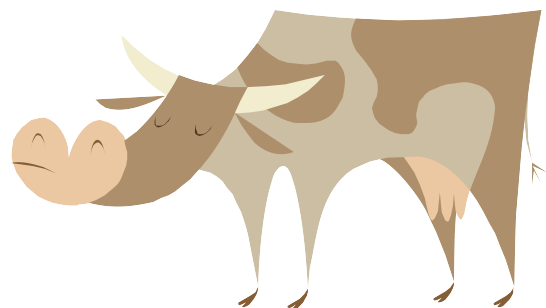

The thump and forefinger mimic the chicken's beak on the other open hand.

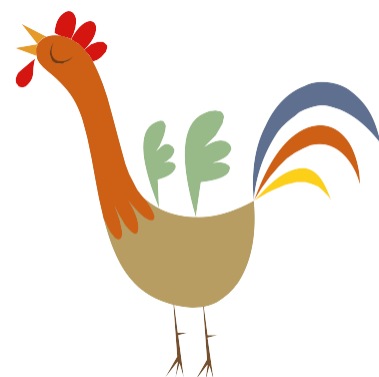

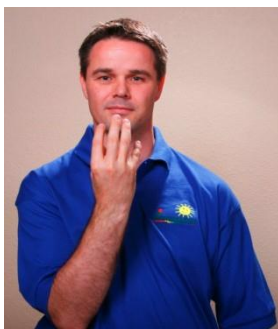


The open hand goes from the mouth and then suddenly pulled away to show that it is too hot to eat .

In back of a C hand-shape the other hand goes from an open pointing down hand to opening all 5 fingers upward.

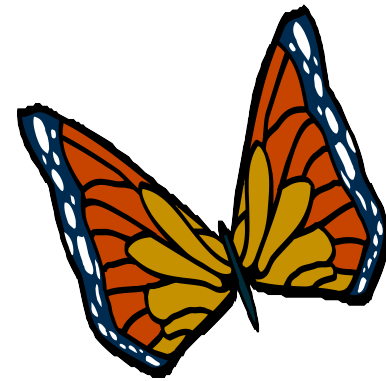

The thumbs lock and the fingers flutter to represent the shape and movement of a butterfly.

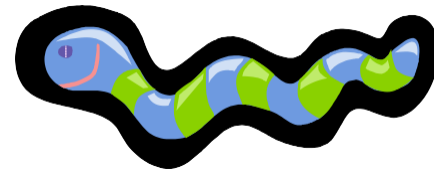

The wiggling forefinger on the open hand represents a worm crawling on the ground.

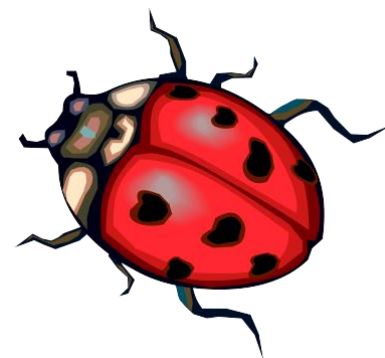
